Birding with RiverBend Lodge (bird species checklist)

The checklist is designed for the guests staying at RiverBend Lodge. It is a list of the bird species that occur in the Nyathi and Main Camp Sections of the Addo Elephant National Park, and it serves as a representation of the bird species that live in this area, as well as those that are regular visitors, and a couple vagrant species that tend to reappear year after year; but please note that it is *not* a comprehensive checklist of all the birds that have ever been recorded in the area, as many of the vagrant records (*that are unlikely to re-occur*) have been omitted from the list.

The checklist accounts for an astounding **260 bird species!** This incredible species richness is a result of the wide range of habitats to be found in the area surrounding RiverBend Lodge; habitats such as woodland, forest, thicket, fynbos and grassland. This includes *31 species* that are endemic to Southern Africa, and another *18 species* that are near endemic. The list also includes *10 species* that are listed on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species and the Addo Elephant National Park plays an important role in the conservation of these endangered bird species.

Explaining Abbreviations:

Endemism and Conservation Status: the conservation status is specifically added for species that are threatened with extinction, and was determined according to the International Union for Nature Conservation (IUCN)'s Red list of Endangered Species. Endemism refers specifically to bird species that are endemic or near endemic to Southern Africa. An endemic species occurs no where else in the world, except for the specified region. These statuses are added as abbreviations after the bird names (where they are relevant). See these abbreviations explained below:

	AB	 - Abundant: a bird species with a high population density, often very conspicuous, and sometimes encountered in large flocks. These birds account for most of the sightings on a birding drive.
\triangleright	VC	- Very Common: a bird species that is easily found and it should be readily encountered throughout
		its natural habitat(s), sometimes also encountered in lodge flocks.
\triangleright	FC	- Fairly Common: a bird species that is fairly easy to find if you explore its habitat thoroughly,
		however, some of these bird species are only common at a very specific locality within the area.
\succ	UC	- Uncommon: a bird species that is not often encountered, possibly due to a lower population
		density, or due to the fact that it is simple very hard to find because of its elusive behaviour.
\triangleright	RR	- Rare: birds for which there are only a few records for the area, or birds that have a extremely
		localised population and are elusive in their behaviour, making them very hard to find.

Residency Status (see column: B):

- BR Breeding Resident: a bird that lives and breeds in the area, and is resident during all seasons, however, it may leave the area during periods of prolonged drought.
- BM Breeding Migrant: a bird that breeds in the area, but then leaves the area in Winter, only to return again in Spring.
- NBM Non-breeding Migrant: a bird that leaves the area in Autumn to go and breed in the Northern Hemisphere, only to return again in Summer.
- NV Nomadic Visitor: a bird that moves in and out of the area in response to food abundance; or visiting the area in response to a severe drought elsewhere; or passing through the area.
- VV Vagrant Visitor: a bird that is a very rare visitor, and does not usually occur in the area.
